North on (156 St SW) for ½ mile- Amberlea Meadows is on the right hand side.

Statement of Principles:

Equine Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction. EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices;
- Requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions;
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses.
- The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

The show committee reserves the right to remove any horse and or rider from the competition at any time without being liable for compensation.

Show management reserves the right to refuse, cancel, postpone, change, reschedule or combine any class or condition they deem advisable.

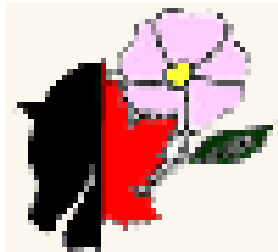

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT for the Welfare of the Horse

- 1. The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) requires all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.**
- 2. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.**
- 3. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.**
- 4. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.**
- 5. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.**

The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

PLEASE NOTE: Scores from a Test of Choice (TOC) cannot be used as a qualifying score. (E7.26.2)

CDI Show Information

Classes are held on Friday through Sunday.

Riders and horses can only compete in one competition per day. Note: Juniors, Pony and Young Riders competitors can enter either the Individual or the Freestyle competition on Sunday, not both.

Judges: Sarah Geikie, Brenda Minor, Libby McMullen.

Qualifiers: The Senior High Performance Committee has given its approval for the CDI2* scores to count as qualifying scores for 2010 Listing!

Requirements:

FEI Passports are not required but a certificate of vaccination is required.

All CDI horses will be stabled separate from the other horses.

Platinum Equine Canada Membership is required.

CDI Permission to Compete 2009 forms must be submitted and all FEI registrations MUST be completed prior to the competition. See [Dressage Canada - Senior High Performance](#) website for more information.

Presentations/Awards

Ribbons will be presented to 6th place for all tests competitions.

Presentations: Mounted presentation to third place will be held at the end of each CDI Day.

Youth Nationals Show Information

Classes are held on Thursday and Friday.

Judges: Sarah Geikie, Brenda Minor, Libby McMullen.

All classes from the level must be entered.

Presentations/Awards

Ribbons will be presented to 6th place for all tests.

Prize money and prizes will be subject to sponsorships received. All First place winners will receive prize money or prizes.

Championship Awards will be given for Freestyle Champion and Technical Champion. Technical Champion is the highest total points for the Team and Individual tests. Freestyle Champion is the highest total points for the Freestyle score and highest technical score.

Presentations: Mounted presentation for Champions and Reserve Champions will be held on Friday.

More details about the awards and presentation schedule will be outlined in the program and will be posted at the show office.

Qualifying criteria for the FEI Youth Nationals Championships can be found on the Dressage Canada Website at www.dressagecanada.org. Complete entries must be received by August 1, 2009. The entry will be held until final qualification is received from Dressage Canada. If they do not qualify, they may have their entries refunded for Youth Nationals or may be transfer their entries to the EC Gold National Show. CDI and EC Gold National Show entries will not be refunded.

Gold Show Information

Classes are held on Thursday through Sunday.

PRESENTATIONS/AWARDS

Ribbons will be presented to 6th place for all tests in all Levels and Categories, except Dressage Seat Equitation classes. Medals will be awarded in the Dressage Seat Equitation classes. Classes may be split or combined where entries warrant.

Prize money and prizes will be subject to sponsorships received. All First place winners in will receive prize money or prizes.

Championship Ribbons will be given for each Level and Category. Para-Equestrian classes will have a championship for each grade. FEI Pony classes will be combined with 2nd Level Championship. FEI Children classes will be combined with 1st level Championship FEI Junior classes will be combined with 3rd level Championship. There will be one FEI Championship for FEI Young Riders through to Grand Prix. To be eligible for Championship Awards, the competitor must present TWO TESTS, all from one Level or Division. The scores from the 2 tests will be combined. If three tests are ridden, the two best will be chosen. Championship ribbons will be presented to Champion and Reserve Champion. There will be no awards presentation, all ribbons may be picked up at the office.

Special Awards

Colin Crone Memorial Trophy is awarded to the high point technical test.

AGE CLARIFICATION

- FEI Children:** Open to competitors from the beginning of the year in which the child reaches the age of 12 until the end of the year in which he reaches the age of 14.
- FEI Pony:** Open to competitors from the beginning of the year in which the child reaches the age of 12 until the end of the year in which he reaches the age of 16.
- FEI Junior:** Open to competitors from the beginning of the year in which the child reaches the age of 14 until the end of the year in which he reaches the age of 18.
- FEI Young Rider:** Open to competitors from the beginning of the year in which the child reaches the age of 16 until the end of the year in which he reaches the age of 21.

ENTRY REGULATIONS

Exhibitors, judges and show officials are responsible for knowledge of the rules. Full details of horse show operation, EC (including FEI) rules, list of recognized judges, and other vital information are in the Rule Book (copyright for the exclusive use of recognized EC shows). Both riders and owners must be members in good standing of Equine Canada (or United States Equestrian Federation) and the Alberta Equestrian Federation (or your provincial organization(PSO) if you reside outside Alberta).

1. **Closing Date:** CDI show entries must be received by July 15, 2009. YN Show and Gold Show entries must be received by August 1, 2009. NO PHONE OR FAX ENTRIES.
2. **Payments:** An entry is not considered valid until it has been paid in full. No post-dated cheques will be accepted. Cheques or money orders should be made out to the **EAADA**. Note: Overpayment of show fees will be considered a donation to the show, at the Committee's discretion.
3. **Limited Entries:** Priority of entry goes to complete and correct entries. Incomplete entries will go to the bottom of the priority list until corrected. Complete and correct entries will be accepted in the order received by the entries secretary until all available judging slots are filled, after which subsequent entries will go on the waiting list in order of receipt.
4. **Signatures:** All entries must have the signature of the owner or authorized agent as well as the signature of the rider. There must also be the signature of the Person Responsible for the Horse.
5. **Cross Entering:** More than one rider may ride the same horse/pony at a competition providing the horse/pony is not entered by two riders in the same class. (Rule 7.11.8 Cross-Entering) You can ride each test only once on the same horse. If you wish your scores to apply in two different Categories (e.g. both Adult Amateur and Open), you must pay the fee for each category, but you will ride the test only once.
6. **Riders:** A rider may ride more than one horse.
7. **Hors concours:** Hors concours entries will be accepted with full fees, if space permits. Entrants are subject to EC rules, and are not eligible for awards.
8. **Substitutions:** Subject to the approval of the Show Committee, substitution of a rider or a horse may be allowed. There will be an administration fee of \$25.
9. **Post entries** for the Gold Show, accompanied by a post entry fee of \$50, may be accepted at the discretion of the Show Committee, if space permits.
10. There will be a **Veterinarian** and **Farrier** on call; names and numbers will be posted in the Show Office.
11. **REFUND OF ENTRIES WILL BE GIVEN IF A VETERINARIAN OR DOCTOR'S CERTIFICATE HAS BEEN RECEIVED THREE (3) DAYS PRIOR TO THE START OF THE SHOW: Fax to 780-492-2371 Attn. GoldRush. THE ADMINISTRATION AND STABLING FEES WILL NOT BE REFUNDED FOR ANY REASON.** In the event of curtailment, postponement or cancellation of the show due to weather, health or disaster conditions, no refunds will be made, with the exception of test fees which, at the discretion of the Show Committee, may be credited.
12. **Drug Testing:** "Any horse entered in any class at a competition subject to the requirement to pay drug testing fees may, while on the competition grounds and on the recommendation of the chairman of the provincial Equine Medication Control Committee or the chair's appointee, be selected for equine medication control testing." (A602.5)
13. **Coggins Test:** A current (within 6 months of the show) Coggins Test certificate is required. Attach a copy to your entry form.
14. **Memberships:** All **owners** and **riders** must be a Gold member of EC and a member of Dressage Canada and be in good standing (Note: CDI participants must be a platinum member of EC). You **MUST** attach a copy of both the current year EC membership card (or United States Equestrian Federation) and your current AEF membership card (or your provincial organization(PSO) if you reside outside Alberta) to your show entry form. Entries will not be complete without these copies.
15. **Disqualification:** Once a horse has been checked in at the show office, it may not, under any circumstances, leave the grounds until after the close of the show or the handing in of competition numbers following the completion of its class(es). Failure to comply will result in disqualification.
16. **Entry Number:** From the time a number has been issued until the end of the competition it is compulsory for the horse or rider/handler to have that number visible at anytime the horse is outside

its stall. Failure to do so may result in elimination or disqualification at the discretion of the ground jury.

17. Any horse arriving on the competition grounds but not competing will be subject to all EC and competition rules and must be assigned a number that must be worn when outside the stable.
18. **Juniors:** As of January 1, 2003, EC and Dressage Canada have deemed that "Junior Competitors must wear proper fitting, approved protective headgear, with the safety harness correctly secured at all times while mounted on competition or event grounds. Approved headgear meets ASTM standards and displays the SEI seal. The British standard, BSI, is also acceptable". **Please note that this rule applies during tests, as well as warm up and any time a Junior competitor is mounted.**
19. **Junior riders** must have permission to participate in the show as indicated by the signature of parent or guardian.
20. Riders competing in **Amateur classes** on a Temporary Sport License must have a signed Amateur Affidavit on file with the competition secretary.
21. **Scheduling** of classes will be dependent on entries received and will be made available on the ADA and Edmonton Gold Rush Dressage Show website and at the show.
22. **Freestyle Eligibility:** A horse/rider combination, to be eligible to enter the freestyle at a national EC competition, must have obtained the following prior to competing in a freestyle: a minimum score of 55% in a dressage test at the same technical level as the freestyle they wish to enter. The dressage score may have been obtained at an EC national dressage competition prior to the competition in which they wish to enter the freestyle, or may be obtained at the same competition. Exemption: All FEI Freestyles.
23. **Freestyle music:** Your freestyle music should be delivered to the Show Office when you arrive. **IT MUST BE RECORDED ON A CD.** The CD must be on a **CD-R** (to assure compatibility with the player). We recommend backing up your CD with a second copy. Label both CDs with the Level of the Freestyle, your name, the horse's name and your signal for starting the music.
24. **Reading of Tests:** Readers will not be provided.
25. You must hand in **your horse's passport with valid sport licence** to the show office in order to obtain your show number and be eligible to compete.
26. Whips: Be aware that the **current rule for maximum length of the dressage whip is 1.20 m. for horses and 1.00 m. for ponies, including the lash.**
27. If you plan to use scores of FEI tests performed at this show as **Qualifying Scores** for the 2009-2010 season, please note this on the entry form. Be sure that you comply with the specific tack rules for qualifying in your level (e.g. whether a whip is allowed, appropriate bridle and bit, etc.) before you ride and present yourself to the steward.

RING REGULATIONS

- All CDI classes will be in 20m x 60m outdoor rings. Para-equestrian classes will be in appropriate ring sizes. All other EC Gold National Show classes will be held in 20m x 60m rings, some classes may be in the indoor arena.
- **Exhibitors are responsible** for having their entries ready to compete when scheduled.
- Competitors **must report to the Steward** for inspection of bridle, saddlery and dress immediately after completing the test and leaving the arena. Any discrepancy found by the steward and/or failure to report will result in elimination. Any competitor not ready to enter the ring when scheduled will be eliminated from the test.
- The **competition rings** will be open for riding on Wednesday, August 19, 2009, but may be closed for setup. Please check at the show office for times.
- A **warm-up ring** will be available for riding. There will be no riding in the **competition rings** during the show except for scheduled classes.
- Only **authorized people** may enter the competition ring or approach the judges' booths or enter the scoring area.

STABLING

- Stabling on the show grounds is mandatory. The rate for the show is \$180.00 (If entering more than one show, please only pay stabling once). Tack stalls are available at a cost of \$170.00. First bedding of either shavings or straw will be provided. Bags of shavings and bales of hay and straw may be purchased from the show office and will be delivered twice a day. Prices will depend on market rate at time of show.
- The stabling is available to competitors from noon on Monday, August 17, 2009. Please do not plan your arrival before this time. If you must arrive outside of these times, please notify the entries secretary in advance so that we may try to accommodate your arrival time.
- All horses must be removed from the show stalls by Monday, August 24, 2009 unless other arrangements have been made directly with Amberlea Meadows.
- **Horses must be put in assigned stalls only.** Please note any special stabling needs on your entry form, which will be followed, if feasible.
- **CDI horses** will be stabled separate from horses competing in the other two shows.
- Bring your own **water pails** for your stall, and your **stall care tools**, too!
- No Smoking in the Barn or Hayshed!

All dogs must be on a leash. Please clean up after your dogs.
