Alternatively: From Hwy 2, west on Hwy 19 for 1 ½ miles. North on Range Rd 253 for 2 miles. Follow the sign - West for 1/8 mile. North on (156 St SW) for ½ mile- Amberlea Meadows is on the right hand side.

The Edmonton Gold Rush Dressage Show is a sanctioned **Gold** competition member of Equine Canada, 2685 Queensview Dr., Suite 100, Ottawa, ON K2B 8K2 and is governed by the rules of the Federation.

Statement of Principles:

Equine Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction. EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices;
- Requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions;
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses.
- The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

The show committee reserves the right to remove any horse and or rider from the competition at any time without being liable for compensation.

Show management reserves the right to refuse, cancel, postpone, change, reschedule or combine any class or condition they deem advisable.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT for the Welfare of the Horse

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) requires all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.**
- 2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.**
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.**
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.**

The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

SHOW INFORMATION

There are two shows being held during the Edmonton Gold Rush Dressage Show:

- 1) FEI Concours de Dressage International CDI 3* Y/J/P/CH (CDI Show)
- 2) Equine Canada Gold National Show (Gold Show)

CDI Show Information

Classes are held on Friday through Sunday.

The FEI has agreed to exceptionally allow for this event, this year only; that competitors are permitted to ride in both the Grand Prix Special and the Grand Prix Freestyle as long as there are less than 10 Grand Prix riders, however points may only be scored from one of the two classes. Riders should indicate their preference for either the Grand Prix Special or the Grand Prix Freestyle on their entry form, in case they may only be permitted to ride in one.

Rider and horse combinations can only compete in one competition per day.

Judges: Axel Steiner, Mariette Withages, Libby McMullen, Marian Cunningham, Lorraine MacDonald.

Requirements:

FEI Passports are required.

All CDI horses will be stabled separate from the other horses.

Platinum Equine Canada Membership is required.

CDI Permission to Compete 2010 forms must be submitted and all FEI registrations MUST be completed prior to the competition. See [Dressage Canada - Senior High Performance](#) website for more information.

Ribbons will be presented to 6th place for all competitions.

Presentations: Mounted presentation to third place will be held at the end of each CDI Day.

Horses must be checked in by noon on Thursday, July 15, 2010 as the vet inspection, in the CDI barn, will start at 1 pm on July 15, 2010.

More details about the awards and presentation schedule will be outlined in the program and will be posted at the show office.

Gold Show Information

Classes are held on Thursday through Sunday.

Ribbons will be presented to 6th place for all tests in all Levels and Categories, except Dressage Seat Equitation classes. Medals will be awarded in the Dressage Seat Equitation classes. Classes may be split or combined where entries warrant.

Prize money and prizes will be subject to sponsorships received.

Championship Ribbons will be given for each Level and Category. Para-Equestrian classes will have a championship for each grade. FEI Pony classes will be combined with 2nd Level Championship. FEI Children classes will be combined with 1st level Championship FEI Junior classes will be combined with 3rd level Championship. There will be one FEI Championship for FEI Young Riders through to Grand Prix.

To be eligible for Championship Awards, the competitor must present TWO TESTS, all from one Level or Division. The scores from the 2 tests will be combined. If three or more tests are ridden, the two best will be chosen. Championship ribbons will be presented to Champion and Reserve Champion.

There will be no awards presentation; all ribbons may be picked up at the office.

Special Awards

Colin Crone Memorial Trophy is awarded to the high point technical test.

AGE CLARIFICATION

- FEI Children:** Open to competitors from the beginning of the year in which the child reaches the age of 12 until the end of the year in which he reaches the age of 14.
- FEI Pony:** Open to competitors from the beginning of the year in which the child reaches the age of 12 until the end of the year in which he reaches the age of 16.
- FEI Junior:** Open to competitors from the beginning of the year in which the child reaches the age of 14 until the end of the year in which he reaches the age of 18.
- FEI Young Rider:** Open to competitors from the beginning of the year in which the child reaches the age of 16 until the end of the year in which he reaches the age of 21.

ENTRY REGULATIONS

1. **Closing Date:** CDI show entries must be received by June 15, 2010. Gold Show entries must be received by July 2, 2010. NO PHONE OR FAX ENTRIES.
2. **Payments:** An entry is not considered valid until it has been paid in full. No post-dated cheques will be accepted. Cheques or money orders should be made out to the **EAADA**. Note: Overpayment of show fees will be considered a donation to the show, at the Committee's discretion.
3. **Limited Entries:** Priority of entry goes to complete and correct entries. Incomplete entries will go to the bottom of the priority list until corrected. Complete and correct entries will be accepted in the order received by the entries secretary until all available judging slots are filled, after which subsequent entries will go on the waiting list in order of receipt.
4. **Signatures:** All entries must have the signature of the owner or authorized agent as well as the signature of the rider. There must also be the signature of the Person Responsible for the Horse.
5. **Cross Entering:** More than one rider may ride the same horse/pony at a competition providing the horse/pony is not entered by two riders in the same class. (Rule 7.11.8 Cross-Entering) You can ride each test only once on the same horse. If you wish your scores to apply in two different Categories (e.g. both Adult Amateur and Open), you must pay the fee for each category, but you will ride the test only once.
6. **Hors concours:** Hors concours entries will be accepted with full fees, if space permits. Entrants are subject to EC rules, and are not eligible for prizes, placings or awards.
7. **Substitutions:** Subject to the approval of the Show Committee, substitution of a rider or a horse may be allowed. There will be an administration fee of \$25.
8. **Post entries** for the Gold Show, accompanied by a post entry fee of \$50, may be accepted at the discretion of the Show Committee, if space permits.
9. **Riders:** A rider may ride more than one horse.
10. There will be a **Veterinarian** and **Farrier** on call; names and numbers will be posted in the Show Office.
11. **CANCELLATIONS/REFUND OF ENTRIES:**

 - Cancellations prior to the closing date will have all fees less the Administration Fee refunded.
 - Cancellations after the closing date but before 9 PM July 12, 2010 with a veterinary certificate or medical certificate will have stabling fees, drug fees, EC levy and 50% of the class fees refunded.
 - Cancellations after the closing date but before 9 PM July 12, 2010 without a veterinary certificate or medical certificate will have stabling fees, drug fees and EC levy refunded. Administration and class fees will not be refunded.
 - Cancellations after July 12, 2010 will have all fees forfeited.
 - In the event of curtailment, postponement or cancellation of the show due to weather, health or disaster conditions, no refunds will be made, with the exception of test fees which, at the discretion of the Show Committee, may be credited.
12. **Drug Testing:** "Any horse entered in any class at a competition may, while on the competition grounds, be selected for equine medication control testing." (A602.5)
13. **Coggins Test:** A current (within 6 months of the show) Coggins Test certificate is required. Attach a copy to your entry form.

14. **Memberships:** All **owners** and **riders** must be a Gold member of EC and a member of Dressage Canada and be in good standing (Note: CDI participants must be a platinum member of EC). The entry form must be signed by the Person Responsible who must be an EC Sport License holder. In the case of junior entries, parents or guardians are entitled to sign their child's entry form without holding an EC Sport License, provided they agree to abide by the rules and penalties contained in the Rulebook. You **MUST** attach a copy of your current year EC membership card (or USEF) to your show entry form. Entries will not be complete without these copies.
15. **Disqualification:** Once a horse has been checked in at the show office, it may not, under any circumstances, leave the grounds until after the close of the show or the handing in of competition numbers following the completion of its class(es). Failure to comply will result in disqualification.
16. **Entry Number:** From the time a number has been issued until the end of the competition it is compulsory for the horse or rider/handler to have that number visible at anytime the horse is outside its stall. Failure to do so may result in elimination or disqualification at the discretion of the ground jury.
17. Any horse arriving on the competition grounds but not competing will be subject to all EC and competition rules and must be assigned a number that must be worn when outside the stable. There is a \$75.00 Non Competing Horse Fee.
18. You must hand in **your horse's passport with valid sport licence** to the show office in order to obtain your show number and be eligible to compete.
19. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to read and be familiar with EC rules and regulations.
20. **Junior riders** must have permission to participate in the show as indicated by the signature of parent or guardian.
21. All riders, grooms, trainers and parents are to conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike and courteous manner. The Gold Rush Show executive reserves the right to eliminate a competitor at their discretion. Discourteous behaviour toward any fellow competitor, Amberlea staff, steward, judge or show committee member will result in immediate expulsion. A protest may be filed with the show secretary accompanied by a deposit of \$100 cash.
22. Equine Canada strongly recommends that all competitors wear ASTM/SEI or BSI approved protective headgear. Any exhibitor in EC competitions may wear protective headgear at any level of competition from Walk/Trot to Grand Prix.
 1. Juniors must wear ATSM/SEI or BSI protective headgear at all times when mounted. The harness must be securely attached. This rule applies even if the junior turns 18 during the competition season in which they continue to compete in junior classes. Failure to comply with these dress regulations will result in elimination. At the tack check a junior may be asked to dismount to allow an inspection of headgear.
 2. Riders competing in FEI Young Rider classes, who have not yet reached their 18th birthday, must wear ATSM/SEI or BSI approved protective headgear at all times when mounted.
 3. All riders wearing protective headgear must have the harness securely attached and the helmet must fit correctly. (E4.1.11)
23. An eligible Temporary Sport License holder may compete in amateur classes provided an Amateur Affidavit has been completed and is on file with the competition secretary. (A208.4)
24. Results achieved while competing with a Temporary Sport License may not be used to qualify for year-end awards, championship competitions, finals or subsequent competitions requiring qualification. (A208.5).
25. **Scheduling** of classes will be dependent on entries received and will be made available on the ADA and Edmonton Gold Rush Dressage Show website and at the show.
26. All tests on Thursday will be judge by **FEI judges**.
27. **Reading of Tests:** Readers will not be provided.
28. **PLEASE NOTE:** Scores from a Test of Choice (TOC) cannot be used as a qualifying score. (E7.26.2)
29. If you plan to use scores of FEI tests performed at this show as **Qualifying Scores** for the 2010-2011 season, please note this on the entry form. Be sure that you comply with the specific tack rules for qualifying in your level (e.g. whether a whip is allowed, appropriate bridle and bit, etc.) before you ride and present yourself to the steward.

30. **Freestyle Eligibility:** A horse/rider combination, to be eligible to enter the freestyle at a national EC competition, must have obtained the following prior to competing in a freestyle: a minimum score of 55% in a dressage test at the same technical level as the freestyle they wish to enter. The dressage score may have been obtained at an EC national dressage competition prior to the competition in which they wish to enter the freestyle, or may be obtained at the same competition. Exemption: All FEI Freestyles.
31. All freestyles will be judged by **FEI judges**
32. **Freestyle music:** Your freestyle music should be delivered to the Show Office when you arrive. **IT MUST BE RECORDED ON A CD.** The CD must be on a **CD-R** (to assure compatibility with the player). We recommend backing up your CD with a second copy. Label both CDs with the Level of the Freestyle, your name, the horse's name and your signal for starting the music.
- Music checks** will take place starting at 3pm Wednesday, July 14, 2010 and 5:30 pm Thursday, July 15, 2010. Please sign up for a time on the list in the office, when you check in. Times will be on a first come basis.

RING REGULATIONS

- All CDI classes will be in 20m x 60m outdoor rings. Para-equestrian classes will be in appropriate ring sizes. All other EC Gold National Show classes will be held in 20m x 60m rings, some classes may be in the indoor arena.
- **Exhibitors are responsible** for having their entries ready to compete when scheduled.
- Competitors **must report to the Steward** for inspection of bridle, saddlery and dress immediately after completing the test and leaving the arena. Any discrepancy found by the steward and/or failure to report will result in elimination. Any competitor not ready to enter the ring when scheduled will be eliminated from the test. A rider who is eliminated must still report to the steward (E4.16.6).
- The arenas will be open for riding on Monday, July 12, 2010 and the **competition rings** will be open for riding on or before Wednesday, July 14, 2010. The arenas may be closed for setup, please check at the show office for times.
- A **warm-up ring** will be available for riding. There will be no riding in the **competition rings** during the show except for scheduled classes.
- Only **authorized people** may enter the competition ring or approach the judges' booths or enter the scoring area.

STABLING

- Stabling on the show grounds is mandatory. The rate for the CDI horses is \$200.00 and the Gold show is \$180.00. Tack stalls are available. First bedding of either shavings or straw will be provided.
- Shavings: Bags of shavings may be purchased in advance on the entry form. Shavings are \$12 per bag and will be delivered to your assigned stall at the start of the show.
- The stabling is available to competitors from noon on Monday, July 12, 2010. Please do not plan your arrival before this time. If you must arrive outside of these times, please notify the entries secretary in advance so that we may try to accommodate your arrival time.
- All horses must be removed from the show stalls by Monday, July 19, 2010 unless other arrangements have been made directly with Amberlea Meadows.
- **Horses must be put in assigned stalls only.** Please note any special stabling needs on your entry form, which will be followed, if feasible.
- **CDI horses** will be stabled separate from horses competing in the Gold Show.
- Bring your own **water pails** for your stall, and your **stall care tools**, too!
- No Smoking in the Barn or Hayshed!

SHOW GROUNDS INFORMATION

Show Office Hours: Wednesday: noon to 8:00 p.m.

Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday: 1 hour before classes begin and as posted.

All dogs must be on a leash. Please clean up after your dogs.

Horses must stay within the competition area.

RV and camper parking will be available. A limited number of RV stalls with electrical hook ups are available at \$15.00 per night. Please indicate number of nights on your entry form.
